



SE 122nd Ave. Safety Improvements

Project Overview:

The Outer-Southeast Community Plan created multi-family zoning on both sides of SE 122nd from SE Raymond south, which resulted in large developments of multi-family housing. SE 122nd is a very wide, high volume arterial carrying over 20,000 cars/day with either substandard sidewalks or no sidewalks at all. Children living in this area must use this dangerous section of road to reach school.

The project would create a 12 ft. sidewalk corridor on each side of 122nd Ave. from SE Raymond to SE Ramona that would provide a safe route to school. It would construct curb ramps for improved handicapped access, plant street trees for environmental and beautification benefits, and provide stormwater treatment to reduce flow into the sewer system and mitigate groundwater contamination.

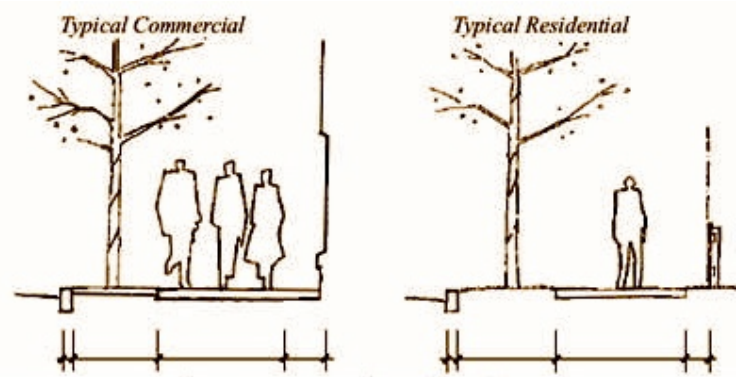
Proposed Conditions

Project Highlights:

- *Introduces “Green” street elements to mitigate storm water runoff that will extend the life of the stormwater system and prevent groundwater contamination
- *Improves safety and access to the area for bicyclists and pedestrians
- *Project would provide a safe route to school for area children
- *Project provides safe access to the Springwater Corridor
- *Will create 40 jobs during construction
